# **Chapter 1 Introduction**

The Digital Signage (hereafter referred as "the device") features a 4-equilateral design with a narrower bezel, slim body, and ultra-thin back shell design. The simple wire guide groove can reasonably wire and manage the power and signal cables.

Digital Signage can switch between landscape and portrait modes freely, allowing simultaneous playback of images and videos in multiple windows. High brightness and high fogging professional commercial display screens ranging from 500 to 700 nits, ensuring clearer content display in bright environments, which is widely used for smart advertising and intelligent promotion.

### **Key Features**

- Ultra-narrow bezel, even bezel design.
- Ultra-thin back shell design with wire guide groove.
- 4K HD picture quality with more detailed image details.
- Saturated high color gamut, clear and wide viewing angles.

# **Chapter 2 Precautions and Operations**

The LCD panel on the device is made by high-precision technology. However, tiny spots on the screen that are always or never lit may be observed, or when observed from side, the color and brightness may appear to be uneven. Yet the above phenomena are common among LCD displays rather than faults and will not affect the performance of the device.

- Our company is not responsible for any fault caused by third-party when operating the device and other failure or damage incurred.
- Do not operate the device in an environment of dust, high humidity, or oil and steam contacting to avoid the risk of fire and damage.
- Do not place the device under direct sunlight or near strong light source.
- Do not place the device near other equipment with strong radiation.
- Do not expose the device to rain or humid environment.
- Do not place the device on unstable or unsafe surface. Avoid strong impact, vibration or vibration.
- Do not operate the device near heating device or place of high temperature to avoid the risk of fire.

# 2.1 Use of Power Cable

- If the power cable is damaged or failed, contact service center. Make sure the power supply is properly grounded and matches the requirements specified by the plate on the shell.
- Do not expose the device to rain or humid environment. Disconnect power plug and antenna in thunderstorm weather.
- If the device will not be used for a long time. Shut down the power of the device and disconnect the power supply.

- Electric discharge may last for a short period of time after the power is shut down. Please wait for two minutes after the power shut down to operate the device.
- Only use the original power cable delivered with the device. Contact authorized dealer to purchase power cable with same specifications.
- Make sure the power supply is grounded.
- Do not let dust or metal attachment adhere to the power plug and socket.
- Do not modify the cable in any form.
- Do not place heavy object on the cable.
- Keep the cable away from heat.
- Do not disconnect the power plug by pulling the cable.
- Keep the power cable away from physical or mechanical damage.
- The cable is applicable only to the Interactive Display. Do not use it on other devices.

# 2.2 Cleaning and Maintenance

- The hole on the rear shell is for heat dissipation. Do not pour or spray liquid to the rear shell or use wet cloth for cleaning.
- Disconnect the power plug before cleaning.
- Do not display images with high brightness on the screen for too long.
- Use a dry, soft and dust-free cloth to clean the device.
- Contact service center for internal cleaning.
- Proper maintenance can avoid certain early-stage failures.
- Clean the device on a regular basis to make the device look new.
- Do not clean the device with water, spray cleaner or industrial chemical reagent. Prevent foreign matters from entering the device.
- Contact qualified service personnel for device maintenance. If the device is damaged, please contact our company, do not carry out unauthorized maintenance.

# 2.3 Precautions for Installation

- Clean the device screen and back before installation for best performance.
- For safety, only use the wall mount or base provided by the manufacturer.
- Contact professional staff for wall mounting.
- Check the accessories before the installation. Contact the dealer if anything is missing.
- Do not install the device too tight. Otherwise the screen may be distorted.
- Mount the device on load-bearing wall.
- Place the device on a stable surface or fix the device steadily on the wall.

- Install the device near an available AC power socket for easy power connection. Use the same ground cable with other devices to prevent signal interference.
- Do not place the device near mechanical vibration source.
- Do not place the device in an environment where insects have easy access.
- Do not let the device face the air conditioner directly to avoid condensing.
- Do not place the device in strong electromagnetic field to avoid radio interference.

# 3.1 Device Startup

Connect the device to power supply, and it will start up automatically.

# 3.2 Shutdown

You can directly switch off the power, or press and hold the power-off button on the remote control to shut down the device.

After pressing the power-off button on the remote control without unplugging the power supply, you can click on the remote control to start up the device.

### 4.3.1 Activate

Step 2 Set your own password in the pop-up window.




Figure 4-2 Pop-Up Window

Step 3 (Optional) Enable the password protection. Once you enable the password protection, you need to enter your password every time before configuring on the detailed information page to protect device security.




Figure 4-3 Enable Password Protection

### **Auto Registration**

#### Steps

Step 1 Click **Register** in the pop-up window after activation. Or you can also go to the detailed information page, and click **Show Information** → **Click to Reconnect** to register.




Figure 4-4 Register in Pop-Up Window




Figure 4-5 Click Show Information to Register

Step 2 Enter **Device Name** (custom), **Server Address**, **Port No.**, and **Authentication Code** of HikCentral FocSign Web Client. Click **OK**.




Figure 4-6 Server Settings



- You can get the Server Address from the platform client.
- **Port No.** is 7660 by default. You can customize it on the platform.
- Authentication Code is used for secondary verification when the device is added to the
  platform. Only when the authentication code input on the platform is consistent with
  that input on the device, the device can be added successfully.
- Step 3 Enter the detailed information page, and the basic configuration on FocSign Player is finished.
- Step 4 On the HikCentral FocSign Web Client, go to **Device Management**  $\rightarrow$  **Device and Server**  $\rightarrow$  **Digital Signage Terminal**  $\rightarrow$  **Auto Registration**  $\rightarrow$  **Add by Auto Registration on Device**.




Figure 4-7 Device Management




Figure 4-8 Auto Registration

Step 5 Click **Refresh All** after completing the server settings on the device. When you find your device on the platform, will become on the device.




Figure 4-9 Refresh to Find Device




Figure 4-10 Detailed Information Page




Figure 4-11 Get User Manual

### 4.3.4 Release via USB Flash Drive

Apart from releasing programs on the platform, you can also insert USB flash drive to release.

### **Before You Start**

- FocSign Player has been activated.
- Go to Settings → Security, and disable Storage Forbid.

#### Steps

Step 1 Create a file named "infoData" in the root directory of the USB flash drive.

Step 2 (Optional) Name the material file. The naming rule is "number\_file name.mp4/jpeg", e.g., 1\_material.mp4, 22\_material.jpeg.



The number should be no more than 5 digits.

Step 3 (Optional) Create a config.txt file in "infoData", and enter "time=10s" in the txt file. The number 10 is the switching time of images, and the default time is 10 seconds. You can edit the number, and insert USB flash drive again. Images will be switched in corresponding time.

# Note

The time should be in the range of 10s-604800s. If the set number is out of the range, the switching time will become 10s by default.

Step 4 Insert the USB flash drive into the device, and enter your password. The device will release programs automatically in full screen.




Figure 4-12 Enter Password to Release



- If you have customized material names, the playing order is the number order of files.
- If you do not customize material names, the files will be played in the order of last edited. The last edited file will be played first. In addition, images will be played first, and then videos will be played.




Figure 4-14 FileBrowser




Figure 5-1 Wired Network Settings

# 5.1.2 Wireless Network Settings

#### Steps

Step 1 Go to **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Network**  $\rightarrow$  **Wireless Network**.

Step 2 Enable WLAN, and you can add a new network or connect to an available network.

#### **Connect to Available Networks**

Tap the desired network in the available network list, and enter the password to connect.

### **Add Other Networks**

#### Steps

### Step 1 Tap Other Networks.

Step 2 Enter network name and select Security.




Figure 5-2 Add Other Network

# 5.1.3 Hotspot Settings

When the device is connected to the wired network, it can provide wireless network for other devices with hotspot enabled.

#### Steps

Step 1 Go to **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Network**  $\rightarrow$  **Hotspot**.

Step 2 Enable **Portable WLAN Hotspot**.

Step 3 Set parameters in the pop-up page.




Figure 5-3 Hotspot Settings

# Note

If the device supports both 2.4 GHz and 5 GHz, set 5 GHz as **AP Frequency**, and recommended channels as **AP Channel** for better experience functions such as wireless screen mirroring.

### 5.1.4 Bluetooth

The remote control, audio, keyboard, etc. can be connected through Bluetooth, and file transfer can also be performed.

Enable **Bluetooth** to search the available devices nearby, and tap the desired one to connect.

# 5.2 Display Settings

Go to **Settings**  $\rightarrow$  **Display** to adjust parameters, such as brightness and screen rotation.




Figure 5-4 Display Settings

### **Backlight Brightness Settings**

### **Picture Quality Settings**

Click to adjust the Image Mode, Contrast, Saturation, Sharpness, and Color Temperature.

#### **Notification Bar**

Enable to see the notification bar.

### **Navigation Bar**

Enable to see the navigation bar.

#### Wallpaper

Click to select wallpaper from Gallery or Wallpaper & Style.

Step 3 Enable **Timed Audio**. You can configure this function on the HikCentral FocSign Web Client.




Figure 5-5 Audio Settings

Step 4 Click the desired application to check details.




Figure 5-6 Application Details




Figure 5-7 Storage Management Details

The activation code here is the password you set when entering the device for the first time.




Figure 5-8 Security Settings




Figure 5-9 System Settings




Figure 5-12 Advanced Settings
